

# Admission FAQs

## Q1. What courses do Satyawati College offer?

Ans: The college offers the following courses:

## Q2. What is the minimum percentage criterion for admission to Satyawati College?

**Ans:** A student must secure at least forty percent in aggregate at XII level in order to be eligible to take admission in any course. One needs to understand that just fulfilling minimum criteria is not the guarantee to get admission in the sought course. Applicants best four subjects (three core disciplines plus one language) percentage is required to fall within the cut off percentage for any given course. The cut-offs percentage for all colleges and courses would be available at [www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in).

**Q3. Is the cut-off percentage different for students residing outside Delhi?**

**Ans:** No, Cut-offs are not different for students from outside Delhi.

**Q4. What were cut-off percentages in 2019-20?**

**Ans:** Cut-off percentages are available at link <http://satyawati.du.ac.in/ADMISSION>.

**Q5. Is there any relaxation for women candidates in Satyawati College?**

**Ans:** Yes, 1% relaxation for Girl Candidates in all courses in the aggregate only.

**Q6. Will the applicants be given admission on a first come, first serve policy after declaration of cut -offs?**

**Ans:** Admissions in the colleges are not based on first come first serve policy. Instead, the applicant who has filled the online registration form and satisfies the criteria and cut -off for a particular programme/course will be considered for admission as per the schedule of admission specified.

**Q7. Is there an NCC quota in Satyawati College?**

**Ans:** Yes, there is an NCC quota in Satyawati College under ECA category.

**Q8. How does one apply through the ECA or sports quota?**

**Ans:** The candidate can apply through UG admission portal for ECA or sports quota.

**Q9. Can I enroll myself for a certificate language course along with my regular graduation course?**

**Ans:** Yes. Satyawati College offers certificate courses in German and French Languages.

**Q10. Will an OBC certificate of 2019-20 be valid for admission this year?**

**Ans:** The University of Delhi will keep updating the applicants through official announcements/press releases as to whether the OBC certificate issued in 2019-20 will be applicable for the academic session 2020-2021. It is advisable that the concerned candidate must possess the latest OBC certificate issued by competent authority.

**Q11. What all documents are required for a student planning to take admission under various caste based reservations?(SC/ST/OBC/EWS)**

**Ans:** Students planning to take admission under caste based reservation should have a caste certificate issued in their name. The OBC certificate

should also mention that the candidate belongs to the Non-Creamy layer and the caste is a part of the Central Government's official list.

**Q12. Is it important to have caste or tribe certificate in the name of a candidate?**

**Ans:** Yes. The concerned certificate must be issued in the name of the candidate who is seeking admission. The certificate must be signed by the competent authority. The OBC certificate must also specify that candidates belong to the non-creamy layer (NCL) and caste is listed in the Central Government list.

**Q13. Once I have taken admission in a particular subject, can I change my subject during the course of study or after completing first year?**

**Ans:** No, once you are admitted in a particular subject, you can change your subject only before the last date of DU admissions 2020, provided seats are available and you meet the requisite cutoff.

**Q14. After getting admission in a particular college can the course be changed later on during the next 3 years?**

**Ans:** No you can't change your course during those 3 years.

**Q15. I'm from science background and want to study either B.A. or B.Com now. Can I apply for the same?**

**Ans:** Yes you can apply to courses like B.Com (Hons.), B.Com and B.A. considering the eligibility criteria and cut-offs as mentioned in Satyawati College prospectus.

**Q16. Is it necessary for the applicant to be present on the day of admission?**

**Ans:** Yes, there are a number of documents which have to be provided by the applicant and duly signed by the candidate on the date of admission.

**Q17. How I can register myself for admission to undergraduate courses in the University of Delhi?**

**Ans:** You can register online for all undergraduate courses through the University admission portal URL <http://admission.du.ac.in> and follow the guidelines to proceed.

**Q18. I have registered online on the DU undergraduate (UG) online portal. Do I still need to fill up the offline form for undergraduate admission?**

**Ans:** No, there's no offline form.

**Q19. Can I apply in multiple programmes/courses in an online form?**

**Ans:** Yes, you may select all programmes/courses of your interest through a single online registration form. It is important to note that you can apply in all merit based as well as entrance based courses through the same online application.

**Q20. Is it possible to change/update the information provided by the applicant in the online application form, once the fee is submitted?**

**Ans.** No, the applicant can't change/update the information once the fee is submitted.

**Q21. I made an error in my online registration form. Do I need to register again using a different email-id?**

**Ans:** No, the portal allows you to register only once. However, you can rectify errors by logging again into your account through the "Edit" button at the end of each session/page till the online registration portal is open & the fee is not paid.

**Q22. How to pay registration fee on DU UG Portal?**

**Ans:** The payment is accepted online only through credit card/debit card/Net-Banking/UPI.

**Q23. Is it possible to apply under ECA/Sports Category once I have paid my registration fee?.**

**Ans:** No, once you have paid the fee, you will not be able to apply under ECA/Sports Category.

**Q24. Why am I not able to preview my application and also not able to pay the fee?**

**Ans:** Please ensure that you have:

1. Completed the mandatory fields (marked with red asterisk) on every page.
2. You have uploaded the required documents under the section 'Uploads'.

**Q25. Will there be any disadvantage for gap year students?**

**Ans:** No, there is no disadvantage for gap year students and they would be treated at par with regular students. They should meet the requisite criteria for admission and must possess the necessary documents/certificates.

**Q26 I did not have Mathematics in class 12<sup>th</sup>. Can I opt for B.A.(Hons.) Economics/ B.Com(Hons.)/ B.Com (Prog.)?**

**Ans:** No, without Mathematics, you are not eligible for above courses.

**Q27. Can I take admission in two different courses or the same course in different colleges after declaration of a cut-off?**

**Ans:** No, you cannot take admission simultaneously in two different courses or same courses in different colleges. In case you take admission at two places, your admission will be canceled from both the colleges/courses.

**Q28. I have completed my class 12<sup>th</sup> from NIOS (National Institute of Open Schooling). Can I get admission in a regular college?**

**Ans:** Yes, you can get admission in a regular college provided you have applied in an available programme/course and meet the cut-off criteria.

**Q29. If my result is awaited; can I submit the online registration form?**

**Ans:** Yes, you can submit the online registration form by choosing "Awaited" in the drop-down menu of "Result Status" on "the Academic Details" page/section while entering the information. However, you will have to fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria/meeting cut-off list of that course/college during the stipulated period.

**Q30. Is rounding off fraction in the percentage of marks permissible?**

**Ans:** No.
