

# Satyawati College: An Introduction

Satyawati College, a constituent college of the University of Delhi was established in 1972 to honour the memory of the great freedom fighter Satyawati Devi (1904-1945). She was the grand daughter of Swami Shraddanand who left an indelible mark in the annals of the nationalist movement.

Her greatest contribution is the fact that she motivated women to join the freedom movement. Her indomitable spirit can be judged by the poems she wrote in jail.

"Once you have stepped forward, never retreat Die before the men in the battlefield

Do not fear bullets or sticks
Put your head forward before the men"

This fearlessness inspired innumerable women including **Aruna Asif Ali** who credited Satyawati with motivating her to join the nationalist movement. Satyawati Devi actively participated in **Civil Disobedience Movement**. She was the leader of women wing and organized breaking of salt law in Delhi where she and her companions made and distributed salt packets. She was sentenced to jail for 2 years but her courageous spirit found expression in poems urging people, and especially women, to strengthen the movement. No wonder **Mahatama Gandhi** affectionately called her **Toofani Bahan**. In her short life she left her mark on the pages of history and **Jaiprakash Narain** called her **Dilli Ki Joan of Arc**. The college wishes to continue with the feisty spirit of Satyawati Devi and emulate her illustrious life.



Accredited **Grade A** by **NAAC**, Satyawati College is one of the prominent colleges of University of Delhi. The college is centrally located in Ashok Vihar and is very close to the North Campus of the University. Satyawati College has a sprawling campus area of over ten acres and has well equipped classrooms, a well stocked library, seminar room, computer labs, sports complex, canteen and common rooms, for both boys and girls. ## Infrastructure



#### DR. K.P BHATT SATYA AUDITORIUM

The college auditorium is named after the illustrious freedom fighter *Behan Satyawati* and Dr. K.P. Bhatt who served as the college principal for 25 years and materialized the dream of an auditorium for the college. It holds a place of pride not only in the college but also in the university, being a state of the art auditorium with a seating capacity of 825 with best quality light and acoustics facilities. It provides a perfect plat form for the expression of creative talents of the students and is forever buzzing with activities like lecturer, debates, dance, theatre and student festivals.



#### **CANTEEN**

College canteen is near the main gate / entrance. It is a place for students to unwind, relax and rest. The canteen provides good quality food and beverages at affordable prices to the college fraternity.



#### **SEMINAR ROOM**

A fully air-conditioned seminar room equipped with sound and visual technology is one of the prized possessions of the college. Debates, discussions, lectures, film screening are organized here on a regular basis.



#### **COMPUTER LABS**

Satyawati College campus is Wi-Fi enabled. Any student can access internet on his/her laptop from anywhere in the campus by obtaining a username and password from the server room. There are two well equipped computer laboratories with around 100 ports.

The laboratories also have computers with JAWSa screen reading software, to facilitate reading for visually challenged students.



#### MEDICAL FACILITY ROOM

The College has a well equipped medical facility located in Room No. 20 of the Old Building which has a full time nurse for any eventuality. The students can also consult the visiting doctor from 10:00 am to 01:00 pm on all working days.



#### **FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE**

The Centre organizes a wide range of activities round the year aimed at creating gender awareness. It also provides counseling services to all students



#### DR. M.K. HALDAR MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The college library named after the founder principal, has a collection of almost One Lakh volumes and is growing with new additions every year. The library has an impressive collection of books, encyclopedias, journals and periodicals. Overhead projector, LCD projector, sound projector are also housed in the college library for the use of departments and ECA societies.

It has a spacious air-conditioned reading hall. There are customized computers with internet facility and learning aids like tape recorders, cassettes, Braille reading material etc. to facilitate learning for visually challenged students. Library staff is warm, friendly and always ready to assist students.











#### **Environmental Studies Lab**

The Environmental studies lab is well equipped with the smart technologies suited to the demands of the new age. Presence of well facilitated smart board and supported by projector makes the way of presentment more lucid and the sessions more interactive. To fulfill the responsibility of awareness and exposing the students with multi discipline nature of environmental issues as well as proposing the alternative solutions the laboratory is well equipped with the tools and equipment for the acquisition of reliable scientific data, with precision and accuracy. With the appropriate use of the latest tools supported by information technology students can put the lab experience to natural world environmental problems like pollution, climate change, resource degradation, biodiversity loss etc. and develop the sense of stewardship of the earth.



#### **SPORTS COMPLEX**

Satyawati College has one of the best sports facilities in Delhi University. Department of Physical Education provides guidance the to students who are interested in different sporting activities. The college has a double-storey sports complex. A lush green sports ground with a well laid out cricket pitch is a delight for cricketers. Sandeep Suri Memorial Cricket Tournament is an annual extravaganza with widespread participation of teams from Delhi/ NCR region. Our students have brought laurels to the college by winning several Inter-college, Inter-university, National and International events. The college provides an ideal sporting atmosphere for differently abled students as well. Some of these students have represented India and won medals in International events as well.

## Extra Curricular Activities: Societies And Committees

#### 1. 'UTKARSH'- THE ART AND CULTURE SOCIETY

The arts and culture society provides a platform for the expression of the creative energy of the young students. The society organizes dance and musical performances and events that enliven the college life and groom the students. The college has many students who are trained in classical as well as folk forms of dance. The society taps this talent pool and trains the students for performances and competitions within the college and other as well as universities.

#### 2. 'ABHIVYAKTI'- THE DEBATING SOCIETY

The Debating Society regularly organizes intra, inter-college and National level debates in English, Hindi, Urdu and Sanskrit. The Society through its activities seeks to cultivate a research oriented competitive debating culture with emphasis on listening skills, intelligent ideas, responsive approach and competent spoken skills. Abhivyakti has conducted debates on various issues such as culture, history, politics, current affairs, law, sports and life. Over the years, our debaters have represented the College in Inter-college, intracollege and national level debates and have made the college proud by winning several prizes.

#### 3. 'THE THIRD ACT'- DRAMATICS SOCIETY

One of the most active societies of the college is the dramatics society, 'The Third Act', holds theatre workshops, lectures and drama productions. This society recognizes the need for young people to express their emotions creatively. Through focused theatre workshops, hidden acting talents are recognized and polished which invariably results in brilliant performances by amateurs. The students have been provided a spacious room in Block A to conduct their workshops and carry on with their practice sessions.

#### 4. FILM SOCIETY (CINEPAT)

The film society conducts regular film screenings which are followed by discussions, analysis and overview of the theme, technique etc. This society seeks to use films as a medium for collective learning and creating an understanding that films have there to offer than more entertainment. The society sensitises students to the fact that films can be both a mirror of our milier and agents of social change.

#### 5. 'TASVEER' PHOTOGRAPHY SOCIETY

Photography society conducts photography workshops for students and trains them to use the camera. In today's environment of love for 'selfies' and photography, this society is quite popular with students.

#### 6. 'SAKSHAM' COMMITTEE FOR CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT

This committee prepares students for their professional lives after college. Students acquire soft skills through workshops, lectures conducted by eminent people. The Committee co-ordinates with the placement cell of Delhi University and assists students in the registration process. In the previous academic year, the committee invited finance, banking and health management companies to the college for campus placements. Several students were selected for recruitment.

#### 7. FOREIGN STUDENTS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Foreign students advisory committee oversees the activities, problems and difficulties, if any, faced by students from other Countries. The committee facilitates participation of foreign students in the college activities and ensures that they feel at home in their new surroundings.

#### 8. SC/ST COMMITTEE

The committee's aim is to empower students belonging to the deprived sections admitted to the college under reserved categories. It conducts workshops for personality development, acquiring computer skills and developing communication skills for these students. There are remedial classes held for the benefit of students who find it difficult to cope with the curriculum.

#### 9. THE NORTH EAST SOCIETY

The North East Society aims to create a welcoming environment for students from the North East in





















College. It seeks to enable them to fully participate in College life. The Society also observes an annual North East Fest which celebrates the unique culture of the region. The society organizes various activities like lectures and screaming of films and documentaries to highlight the issues impacting the people of the North-East.

#### 10. 'UJJWALA' -THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college publishes a magazine annually which has poems, stories, essays by students and teachers. The college magazine provides students with an opportunity to express themselves creatively. The magazine named 'Ujjwala' is multi-lingual with a section each in English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Urdu.

#### 11. INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT

It deals with all the incidents amounting to any kind of Sexual Harassment with in the premises of the College.

#### 12. FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE

The Family Counseling Centre organizes a wide range of activities round the year aimed at creating gender awareness. The centre maintains a library which has a rich collection of books, pamphlets, and films on issues related to gender. This centre also provides counselling services to students.

#### 13. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell is committed towards providing a barrier-free environment to facilitate quality education and equitable access to career opportunities for differently-abled students. it has provided laptops (with special software for VH students) to most of the PWD students. Equal Opportunity Cell has also provided 26 DAISY players to our VH students and got repaired old iPods. Regular meetings are held to address student issues.

#### 14. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The NCC unit of the college trains boys and girls as cadets in the Army and Navy wings. Our cadets have had the honor of participating in the Republic Day parade and Special National Camps. Rigorous training that the students undergo in NCC helps them maintain a fine balance between mind and body.

#### 15. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

College has an active group of student volunteers associated with the NSS. The NSS volunteers conduct reading sessions for visually challenged students. Their activities include working with nearby slum population, organizing and participating in blood donation camps, teaching children of construction workers in the college campus. The NSS organizes an **Annual Function "Sarokar" every year.** 

#### 16. STUDENTS UNION

Satyawati College has a Students' Union which is elected by the students every year. **However a first year student can only contest for the post of Central Councilor,** the rest of the posts of the union are open only to second and third year students.

#### 17. ALUMNI COMMITTEE

Satyawati Alumni committee has been working very actively for last two years. The college is trying to collect data of its old students using social and electronic media. The Alumni meet is organized by the college alumni committee. Online registration has been introduced to facilitate in updating the list of alumni.

Alongwith these comittees, which are open to all students, every department has it own comittee which is open to the students of that particular discipline.

#### **COLLEGE FESTIVAL 'UTSAV'**

The Annual College festival 'UTSAV' is held jointly by the Arts and Culture Society and the Students Union. The Festival provides an ideal opportunity to the students to show their individual and collective talents in the various competitions.

# **B.A. Programme**

The BA Programme is an inter-disciplinary course which provides students a comprehensive idea of different disciplines of humanities and social sciences. B.A. Programme course requires a student to offer a combination of discipline, language, foundation and application courses over six semesters.

#### (i) Discipline Courses:

B.A. Programme Course requires a student to offer any two discipline courses in all six semesters. College offers following combinations of discipline courses and students can choose any one of these. Sections have been divided on the basis of subject combinations and medium of instruction.

Section A	-	Economics and Political Science OR Political Science and Sanskrit OR Sanskrit and History	Hindi Medium
Section B	_	History, Political Science and Hindi (Choose any Two)	Hindi Medium
Section C	_	OMSP, Economics, English, Maths, Political Science and History (Choose any Two)	English Medium
Section D	_	Economics, English, History, Political Science and Maths (Choose any Two)	English Medium
Section E	_	History, Political Science and Hindi (Choose any Two)	Hindi Medium

#### (ii) Language Courses:

A student shall offer eight language papers over six semesters. Of these, 2 papers are to be in English and 2 papers are to be in Hindi/other Indian Languages.

- (a) English Compulsory in Semesters I, II, III and IV.
- (b) Hindi/Modern Indian Language Compulsory in Semester I, II, V and VI.

Note: Students who have studied English upto Class XII will opt for English A and those who have studied the subject up to Class X will opt for English B. Likewise, students who have studied Hindi up to class XII will opt for Hindi A and those who have studied it upto Class X will opt for Hindi B and those who have studied it upto Class VIII will opt for Hindi C.

M.I.L. - Students who have not studied Hindi at any level can take Political Science, Economics and History in lieu of M.I.L. (Modern Indian Languages)

## General Rules for Admission



- 1. Admission to various courses will be made according to the procedure and guidelines laid down by the University of Delhi
- 2. The College gives a relaxation of 1%in the aggregate marks to female applicants as per University of Delhi Guidelines.
- 3. The admission will be granted only to those students who fall within the range of various lists announced by the College. If a student does not take admission in the list inwhich he / she is eligible, he / she will be considered for admission on the last day of the next list subject to availability of seats.
- 4. If a student who takes admission in OBC category and in the next list becomes eligible for General category he / she will be transferred to this category.
- 5. Students should note that admissions are made strictly on merit. All admissions are provisional. If any discrepancy is found at any stage the admission is liable to be cancelled.
- 6. For admission to M.A., the applicant should be twenty years of age as on 1st October 2018.
- 7. All the information regarding admission will be displayed on the College Notice Board/College Website. No individual intimation regarding admission will be sent. Therefore, applicants should see College Notice Board / College Website for information regarding admission.
- 8. The decision of the Admission Committee will be final.
- 9. The successful students will have to deposit the fees within the prescribed period, failing which the admission will automatically stand cancelled. Fee has to be deposited online only through University Admission Portal.
- 10. Rounding off fraction in the percentage of marks is not permissible for admission to any course in the College.
- 11. The College does not admit/re-admit the following categories of students:
  - (a) Those who failed in a university examination.
  - (b) Those who failed to take university examination for any reason including shortage of attendance.
  - (c) Those whose results were with held on account of use of unfair means.
- 12. For any information and advice regarding admission, candidates should contact 'Helpdesk' available in the college.
- 13. Gap year students may be admitted on furnishing an undertaking on a Rs. 10/- non-judicial paper that he/she was neither expelled from any institution nor was involved in any criminal activity nor he/she took admission in any other College.
- 14. Students should self attest all of the copies of their documents / papers.
- 15. Process after registration for merit-based admissions:
- i. The applicants must check the centralized Admission Web Portal and the respective college websites for the announcements of cut-offs of different programmes.
- ii. The applicants who meet the requisite cut-off should login to the UG admission portal using their registration account and select college/programme where she/he wishes to take admission and meets the desired cut-off criterion.
- iii. The applicant shall take a print out of the admission/registration form and along with the list of documents/certificates (see Section 8 for details), proceed to the respective college for verification of mark-sheets/certificates, calculated marks percentage with relation to the cut-off, depending on the programme/course. The schedule for verification of documents in the colleges is

- also given in Section 2.6.
- iv. After this, the college will approve the admission on the UG admissions portal. The applicant will then be required to log-on to the UG admission portal to make the online Admission Fee payment (it varies from college to college) through the available online payment options. The approved applicant is permitted to make online admission fee payment till 12 noon of the next day of the last day of admission cut-off list (in which the admission is sought).
- v. Please note that an applicant's admission in a college is completed only after realization of the fee payment on the UG admission portal within the prescribed time-limit.
- vi. An applicant can take admission only in one programme in one college at any given time. In case an admitted student wishes to withdraw/cancel the admission in any programme/college, she/he may cancel her/his admission online (cancellation fee will be charged as per the University Cancellation Policy), and The applicant can proceed to take admission in another programme/college. Admission fee will be adjusted automatically and the applicant will need to pay only the balance, if the fee is more in the new college/programme in which the admission is being sought. In case the fee is less in the new college/programme, the balance would be refunded to the applicant's account as per the College/University rules after the admissions are closed
- vii. The reservation and relaxation policy of the University of Delhi for admission under various categories is provided in undergraduate admission bulletin.
- viii. The announcement of **cut-off lists** for all programmes / categories (UR/OBC/SC/ST/PwD/KM) will be made through University website only. The schedule for announcement of cut-off lists is given in section 2.6 of university undergraduate admission bulletin.
- ix. The CW (Children/Window of Armed Forced Personnel) applicants shall check the admission schedule and procedure in undergraduate admission bulletin.
- x. The admission schedule for admissions under Sports/ECA categories will be announced on the centralized admission Web Portal after the registration process is completed.
- xi. The colleges shall admit all the applicants who meet the announced cut-off criteria. There will not be any **-first come first serve-** policy.
- xii. The admitted students will have to fulfill the minimum attendance requirement as per university rules. The students have to submit a written undertaking to this effect at the time of admission.
- xiii. The applicants who could not take admission in a given cut-off list (where they indeed met the criterion) may be considered for admission on the last day of admission in the immediate next cut-off list only, subject to availability of seats. For Boards, like International Baccalaureate and others, whose results are declared late, the applicants may be considered for admission during whichever cut-off list their results are declared, subject to availability of seats and provided the applicant had successfully completed the online registration process.
- xiv. The colleges shall strictly follow the University guidelines with respect to gap year policy. The applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for the purpose of admission to the undergraduate programmes.
- xv. The applicants seeking admission under ECA category may check the Section 9.10.1 and Annexure IV of university bulletin for further details.
- xvi. The applicants seeking admission under Sports category may check the Section 9.10.2 and Annexure V of university bulletin for further details.
- xvii. There shall not be any Additional Eligibility Criterion For any category in any college/programme.

# Discipline & Attendance Rules

- Students are accountable for their conduct to the Principal of the College and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the College, which may amount to breach of repute, discipline or interference with the discipline and normal working of the College. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violating any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary actions involve warning, and/or fine and/or suspension from the class, from examination, from the College or any such action as provided in ordinance XV-B and the rules of discipline framed under it. Pending an enquiry into his/her conduct, the authorities have the right to suspend a student from the College.
- 2. Students should take proper care of College property and must not spoil or cause any damage to or tamper with furniture and fittings.
- 3. Names of students who indulge in acts of indiscipline in the university examination may be struck off from the College rolls.
- 4. Ragging in any from is banned. Any student found indulging in it would be guilty of gross indiscipline and an FIR will be filed against him/her with the police as per the decision of the Hon. Supreme Court. Any one found indulging in eve-teasing shall also be dealt with under ordinance XV-B & XV-C.
- 5. In the matter of attendance lectures and tutorials, the students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi including DU EC Resolution No. 138 dated 05-06-1975. No student is eligible for promotion to the next higher class or to take a University Examination unless he/she has attended two-third of the lectures, tutorials and preceptorial held separately. As per decision of 370th meeting of staff council, students enrolled in the first year (2019-20) are to have minimum Sixty Six Percent (66%) attendance in each semester in order to appear for semester exam, failing which they will be debarred for the appearing in the said exam.
- 6. All application for leave of absence due to sickness must be supported by a Medical Certificate and should reach the Principal not later than a week after the student returns to the College after his/her illness. This rule will be enforced strictly in giving benefit of attendance on medical ground.
- 7. The areas near the classrooms are marked as the Silence Zone. Therefore, students are advised not to loiter/ make noise in this zone. They are advised to utilize their free periods for creative activities such as visiting library, playing games etc.
- 8. An Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. A student is not allowed to enter the college premises without showing his/her identity card at the College gate. A student must carry his/her identity card while he/she is in the college premises. Duplicate identity card will be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- subject to reporting of loss to the College authorities.
- 8. First year students CANNOT contest college student union election except for the post of DUSU councillors.
- 9. All information is displayed on the student notice board. Hence, students are advised to read notices regularly. All the information is also posted o the college website and the students are advised to stay updated. Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as a plea or an excuse for any delay in any matter.
- 10. Suggestion Box has been provided on the ground floor near the library. Students are advised to make use of it.
- 11. Students are not permitted to receive or entertain visitors in the College. In case such visits are essential, prior permission of the principal is necessary.
- 12. Travel Concession Facility for visit to hometown is available for the students. They are advised to contact the Administrative Office in Room No. 1.
- 13. College has a bus pass verification centre. To avail this facility, students may contact the concerned staff during 10.00 A.M. to 1.00 P.M. on all working days.
