PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSIONS

Admission to all UG Programs are done on the basis of the eligibility requirements, criteria, and procedures specified by the University on its website, Under-Graduate Bulletin of Information - 2023 (UG-BOI) and Common Seat Allocation System-2023 (CSAS).

The eligibility criteria for every Program offered at the UG level have been published in the UG Bulletin of Information-2023 (UG BOI-2023) (available on the admission website of the University, admission.uod. ac.in). Candidates must check the eligibility criteria carefully from UG BOI-2023 and the admission website. There are no additional eligibility criteria besides the ones stipulated by the University through its website, UG BOI 2023 and CSAS-2023, published on the admission website of the UoD.

For the academic year 2023-24, admission to all UG Programs of UoD will be done on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test- Under-Graduate 2023 (CUET (UG) – 2023).

- CUET (UG) 2023 is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The candidate may note that the role of NTA is limited to the conduct of CUET (UG) - 2023, declaration of results, and handling of queries related to the entrance examination. Simply appearing in CUET (UG) - 2023 will not be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in UoD. For admission to the UoD UG Programs, a candidate has to apply in CSAS-2023.
- 2. Before initiating the application process, the candidate is advised to read the contents of UG BOI-2023 and CSAS-2023 carefully, and consult the Delhi University Act, 1922, its amendments and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, Regulations, and Notifications of the UoD available on the University



website, www.du.ac.in shall be final and binding.

- Candidates applying to UoD must refer to the UG BoI-2023 for Common Minimum Eligibility criteria and Program-Specific Eligibility criteria. (http:// du.ac.in/uploads/new-web/21042023_BOI-UG. pdf).
- The candidate must refer to the list of Programs, Program-Specific Eligibility Criteria, seat matrix, fee structure and other relevant information published on the admission website of UoD before selecting the Programs.
- Determination of eligibility and verification of documents for admission to UoD will be the sole purview of UoD.
- Only the candidate who has appeared in CUET (UG) - 2023 and has passed Class XIIth from a single recognized board will be eligible to apply for the CSAS-2023.
- 7. It is mandatory for the candidate to apply and fill preferences online in CSAS-2023 of UoD through the admission website of UoD (https://admission. uod.ac.in). Application submitted through any other mode will not be accepted under any circumstances.
- 8. Seat allocation to all UG Programs will be based solely on the scores obtained in CUET(UG) 2023.
- For seat allocation in Performance-based Programs, and ECA and Sports Supernumerary Quotas, a combined score of CUET (UG) - 2023 and Performance Tests/ Trials and/or certificates will be considered.
- 10. The CSAS-2023 merit lists published on the Admission website shall be adhered to by all the Colleges of UoD.
- 11. Candidates are advised to check their dashboard, email, and admission website (www.admission. uod.ac.in) for all communications and updates related to admissions.
- 12. College/UoD will not be responsible for a candidate's lack of awareness of the admission guidelines, schedule, Eligibility Criteria, and CSAS-2023 rules. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to keep checking the dashboard, email and admission website of UoD regularly.
- 13. Non-compliance with the requirements for admission, including non-submission of relevant

documents and/or non-payment of Fee/s within the stipulated date and time, the candidate will lose his/her right to admission.

- 14. The candidate will be required to appear in person to verify the original documents as and when notified by the University/College.
- 15. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories (including PwBD, CW, and KM). Candidates applying under SC/ST/OBCNCL/EWS/Minority/CW/PwBD/ KM categories will be required to upload the certificates/documents of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the Competent Issuing Authority.
- 16. If at any stage, documents submitted by the candidate relating to the admission are found to be fake/non-genuine and/or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the said candidate will not be given admission and if already admitted, admission will be canceled without any prior notice in this regard. If the same is found after completing the Program, his/her degree will be revoked and appropriate legal action will be taken against him/her.
- 17. A candidate's participation in the admission process will be provisional. If, at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be canceled ipso facto and appropriate legal action will be taken against such candidate.
- 18. University or College will not refund Admission Fee in case any candidate is found ineligible at a later stage.
- 19. The University or College reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate who violates the rules and regulations laid down by the UoD.
- 20. The Common Seat Allocation System 2023 is divided in Three Phases:
 - PHASE I: APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY OF
 DELHI
 - PHASE II: FILLING THE PREFRENCES FOR PROGRAMS AND COLLEGES
 - PHASE III: ALLOCATION-CUM-ADMISSION

For admission to UoD, Candidate will have to

successfully complete all the Tree Phases of CSAS within the stipulated time.



Seat Allocation and Admission

Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate.

In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round, s(he) must "Accept" ONE Allocated seat ONLY.

Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of CSAS-2023.

ONLINE APPROVAL BY THE COLLEGE

Once the candidate "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will check the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate. The Cllege will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

- 1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
- 2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate.
- Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- 4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.

During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate. After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate. No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In case of Approval

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee'.

In case of Rejection

For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

- 1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.
- 2. Not-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.
- 3. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.
- 4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.
- 5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

RESPOND TO QUERIES (IF ANY) DURING COLLEGE APPROVALS

During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2023.

ADMISSION TO THE PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

After the College approves, the candidate will have to pay the Admission Fee for the approved seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee. *If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2023 allocation rounds. The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2023 allocation rounds.*

Subsequent Rounds of Allocation

- Based on the availability of the seats that arise due to rejections, cancellations, and withdrawals, the University may announce multiple allocation rounds. The UoD will display the vacant seats on its admission website (admission.uod.ac.in) before every allocation round.
- All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2023 will be eligible for all allocation rounds, except those whose allocated seat/admission has been

- All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for respective CSAS-2023 allocation round, subject to the availability of seats.
- Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent rounds of allocation.

(企) Upgrade or Freeze

Upgrade

An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option, which will allow upgradation to a higher preference submitted by the candidate. Admitted candidates who opt for upgradation will automatically be upgraded based on the allocation policy.

Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents to consideration of an offer of admission to a Program + College Combination of his/ her higher preference in the subsequent round (if any). His/her current admitted seat will be auto canceled if new preference/s is/are allocated.

A candidate who opts for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College Combinations that were higher in preference than the allocated one.

The Program + College Combination in which s(he) had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent round. Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent round.

The upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated his/her first preference.

It will be the responsibility of the candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered a grievance in any circumstance.

A candidate who gets upgraded will have to 'Accept' the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded Allocated Seat/s. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat/s, it will, by default, be considered canceled and the candidate will In case, a candidate does not get upgraded, his/her admission to the earlier seat will be retained.

Freeze

A candidate who has taken admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through his/her dashboard. On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation."

If an admitted candidate neither opts for upgradation nor opts for Freeze, and remains inactive for a round, the admission taken by him/her will be retained and he/she will not be considered for upgradation.

Cancellation of Provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission

- 1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
- 2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fees within the stipulated time.
- The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/ certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
- The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/ admission is canceled due to the above-mentioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD through CSAS-2023.



A candidate who has taken an admission but wishes to withdraw can do so through his/her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

A candidate who withdraws his/her admission will be out of CSAS-2023. He/she will forfeit his/her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD. No further participation in any of the subsequent There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

NOTE: Candidate should withdraw the admission only if he/she is sure of not continuing with the University of Delhi.

Spot Admission

After the completion of regular CSAS-2023 rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot round/s of admission.

Candidates who applied for CSAS-2023 but were not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of the Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Admissions.

On the announcement of Spot Admission, the admission of all already candidates will be locked and they will not be considered for upgrades. Similarly, the admitted candidates will not be allowed to withdraw their admissions.

To be considered in a Spot Admission round, the candidate will have to opt for 'Spot Admission' through his/her dashboard.

For every Spot Admission round the University will display the vacant seats of each Program. A desirous candidate will be able to select ONLY ONE Program.

In Spot Admissions, allocations will be done on the basis of the following criteria:

- 1. Availability of seats.
- 2. Program-Specific merit.
- 3. Order of Preference of College.
- 4. Category.
- Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document (CSAS-2023), UG BOI – 2023, or published on the admission website of UoD.

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a Spot round. Failure to accept the allocated seat in the Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and s(he) will be out of CSAS.

There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the Spot Admission rounds. **The seat allocated in a particular Spot Admission round will be final** and will not be upgraded in any subsequent round of Spot Admission rounds.

E Tie-Breaking Rules

In the event of a tie, where two or more candidates have the same CUET(UG) - 2023 merit score for a Program + College Combination, the following rules will be applied in the stated order to break the tie:

- 1. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 3 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
- 2. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 4 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
- 3. The candidates with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 5 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
- 4. Age of the candidate; preference will be given to the candidate having an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in the Class X certificate).

Remittance of Fee

Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful realization of the Admission Fee. The admission fee must be paid only through the candidate's dashboard. If the admission fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances.

For all payments, candidates should use any of these payment modes: Net Banking / Debit Card / Credit Card / UPI.

NOTE: Upon successful payment of the Admission Fee, the candidate must keep a record of the payment's transaction ID/ Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking details and the transaction date as proof for future reference.


Refund Policy








Computer Labs

B.A. PROGRAMME

The BA Programme is an inter-disciplinary course which provides students a comprehensive idea of different disciplines of humanities and social sciences. B.A. Programme course requires a student to offer a combination of discipline, language, foundation and application courses over six semesters.

Discipline Courses

B.A. Programme Course requires a student to offer any two discipline courses in all six semesters. College offers following combinations of discipline courses and students can choose any one of these. Sections have been divided on the basis of subject combinations and medium of instruction. (Please refer B.A. SEAT MATRIX, Page no. 3).

Section A	Economics and Political Science OR Political Science and Sanskrit OR Sanskrit and History - (Hindi Medium)
Section B	History, Political Science and Hindi (Choose any Two) - (Hindi Medium)

Section D	Economics, English, History, Political Science and Maths (Choose any Two) – (English Medium)
Section E	History, Political Science and Hindi (Choose any Two) – (Hindi Medium)

Language Courses

A student shall offer eight language papers over six semesters. Of these, 2 papers are to be in English and 2 papers are to be in Hindi/other Indian Languages.



- (a) English Compulsory in Semesters I, II, III and IV.
- (b) Hindi/Modern Indian Language Compulsory in Semester I, II, V and VI.

Note: Students who have studied English upto Class XII will opt for English A and those who have studied the subject up to Class X will opt for English B. Likewise, students who have studied Hindi up to class XII will opt for Hindi A and those who have studied it upto Class X will opt for Hindi B and those who have studied it upto Class VIII will opt for Hindi C.

M.I.L.: Students who have not studied Hindi at any level can take Political Science, Economics and History in lieu of M.I.L. (Modern Indian Languages)

- 1. There will be three following streams of English for B.A. & B.Com (Prog.) students based on their class XII marks.
 - i. 80% and above English Language Through Literature - 'English A'
 - ii. 60% and above up to 80% English Fluency - 'English B'
 - iii. Less than 60% English Proficiency 'English C'
- 2. There is a streaming in AECC according to last English Examinations taken in school by student. AECC A for students who have studied English till class 12th, AECC B for students who have studied English till class 10th, AECC C for students who have studied English till Class 8th.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: SOCIETIES AND COMMITTEES



1. 'UTKARSH'- THE ART AND CULTURE SOCIETY

The arts and culture society provides a platform for the expression of the creative energy of the young students. The society organizes dance and musical performances and events that enliven the college life and groom the students. The college has many students who are trained in classical as well as folk forms of dance. The society taps this talent pool and trains the students for performances and competitions within the college and other as well as universities.

2. 'ABHIVYAKTI' – THE DEBATING SOCIETY

The Debating Society regularly organizes intra, intercollege and National level debates in English, Hindi, Urdu and Sanskrit. The Society through its activities seeks to cultivate a research oriented competitive debating culture with emphasis on listening skills, intelligent ideas, responsive approach and competent spoken skills. Abhivyakti has conducted debates on various issues such as culture, history, politics, current affairs, law, sports and life. Over the years, our debaters have represented the College in Inter-college, intracollege and national level debates and have made the college proud by winning several prizes.

3. 'THE THIRD ACT' – DRAMATICS SOCIETY

One of the most active societies of the college is the dramatics society, 'The Third Act', holds theatre workshops, lectures and drama productions. This society recognizes the need for young people to express their emotions creatively. Through focused theatre workshops, hidden acting talents are recognized and polished which invariably results in brilliant performances by amateurs. The students have been provided a spacious room in Block A to conduct their workshops and carry on with their practice sessions.

4. FILM SOCIETY (CINEPAT)

The film society conducts regular film screenings which are followed by discussions, analysis and overview of the theme, technique etc. This society seeks to use films as a medium for collective learning and creating an understanding that films have there to offer than more entertainment. The society sensitizes students to the fact that films can be both a mirror of our miller and agents of social change.

5. PHOTOGRAPHY SOCIETY (TASVEER)

Tasveer Society of Satyawati College is a platform to bring together the like-minded people and share knowledge wedge about the art and science of Photography. The society encourages students to study light and imparts tips on composition in the form of workshops, seminars, event coverage and photo walks. Each year the society organizes such activities that give students a chance to learn photography and utilize their camera to the fullest and become sensitized to the world around. The society "focuses" on interaction between experts and students in addition to enhancing peer learning in photography and build an environment to capture memories forever. The society has its own studio and Dslr Camera which helps student learn the art of photography the best.

6. 'SAKSHAM' COMMITTEE FOR CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT

This committee prepares students for their professional lives after college. Students acquire soft skills through workshops, lectures conducted by eminent people. The Committee co-ordinates with the placement cell of Delhi University and assists students in the registration process. In the previous academic year, the committee invited finance, banking and health management companies to the college for campus placements. Several students were selected for recruitment.

7. FOREIGN STUDENTS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Foreign student's advisory committee oversees the activities, problems and difficulties, if any, faced by students from other Countries. The committee facilitates participation of foreign students in the college activities and ensures that they feel at home in their new surroundings.

8. SC/ST COMMITTEE

The committee's aim is to empower students belonging to the deprived sections admitted to the college under reserved categories. It conducts workshops for personality development, acquiring computer skills and developing communication skills for these students. There are remedial classes held for the benefit of students who find it difficult to cope with the curriculum.

9. THE NORTH EAST SOCIETY

The North East Society aims to create a welcoming environment for students from the North East in College. It seeks to enable them to fully participate in College life. The Society also observes an annual North East Fest which celebrates the unique culture of the region. The society organizes various activities like lectures and screaming of films and documentaries to highlight the issues impacting the people of the North-East.

10. 'UJJWALA' -THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college publishes a magazine annually which has poems, stories, essays by students and teachers. The college magazine provides students with an opportunity to express themselves creatively. The magazine named 'Ujjwala' is multi-lingual with a section each in English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Urdu.

11. INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT

It deals with all the incidents amounting to any kind of Sexual Harassment with in the premises of the College.

12. FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE

The Family Counseling Centre organizes a wide range of activities round the year aimed at creating gender awareness. The Centre maintains a library which has a rich collection of books, pamphlets, and films on issues related to gender. This Centre also provides counselling services to students.

13. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell is committed towards providing a barrier-free environment to facilitate quality education and equitable access to career opportunities for differently-abled students. it has provided laptops (with special software for VH students) to most of the PWD students. Equal Opportunity Cell has also provided 26 DAISY players to our VH students and got repaired old iPods. Regular meetings are held to address student issues.

14. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The NCC unit of the college trains boys and girls as cadets in the Army and Navy wings. Our cadets have had the honor of participating in the Republic Day parade and Special National Camps. Rigorous training that the students undergo in NCC helps them maintain a fine balance between mind and body.

15. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

College has an active group of student volunteers associated with the NSS. The NSS volunteers conduct reading sessions for visually challenged students. Their activities include working with nearby slum population, organizing and participating in blood donation camps, Red Ribbon Club, teaching children of construction workers in the college campus. The NSS organizes an Annual Function "Sarokar" every year.

16. STUDENTS UNION

Satyawati College has a Students' Union which is elected by the students every year. However a first year student can only contest for the post of Central Councilor, the rest of the posts of the union are open only to second and third year students.

17. ALUMNI COMMITTEE



Ward Quota

Admission to the wards of the University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching, will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9 a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments/notifications thereof. Candidate must upload a valid Employment Certificate issued by the due officials. The certificate must clearly mention the status of employment of the parent/s. Only the certificate uploaded at the time of the CSAS(UG)-2023 Application form will be considered. I-Card, Aadhar Card, or any other document will not be accepted.

Discipline & Attendance Rules

- 1. Students are accountable for their conduct to the Principal of the College and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the College, which may amount to breach of repute, discipline or interference with the discipline and normal working of the College. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violating any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary actions involve warning, and/or fine and/or suspension from the class, from examination, from the College or any such action as provided in ordinance XV-B and the rules of discipline framed under it. Pending an enquiry into his/her conduct, the authorities have the right to suspend a student from the College.
- 2. Students should take proper care of College property and must not spoil or cause any damage to or tamper with furniture and fittings.
- 3. Names of students who indulge in acts of indiscipline in the university examination may be struck off from the College rolls.
- 4. Ragging in any form is banned. Any student found indulging in it would be guilty of gross indiscipline and an FIR will be filed against him/her with the police as per the decision of the Hon. Supreme Court. Anyone found indulging in eve-teasing or sexual harassment shall also be dealt with under ordinance XV-B, XV-C and XV-D.
- 5. In the matter of attendance lectures and tutorials, the students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi including DU EC Resolution No. 138 dated 05-06-1975. No student is eligible for promotion to the next higher class or to take a University Examination unless he/she has attended two-third of the lectures, tutorials and preceptorial held separately. As per decision of 370th meeting of staff council, students enrolled in the first year (2019-20) are to have minimum Sixty Six Percent (66%) attendance in each semester in order to appear for semester exam, failing which they will be debarred for the appearing in the said exam.
- All application for leave of absence due to sickness must be supported by a Medical Certificate and should reach the

Principal not later than a week after the student returns to the College after his/ her illness. This rule will be enforced strictly in giving benefit of attendance on medical ground.

- 7. The areas near the classrooms are marked as the Silence Zone. Therefore, students are advised notto loiter/ make noise in this zone. They are advised to utilize their free periods for creative activities such as visiting library, playing games etc.
- 8. An Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. A student is not allowed to enter the college premises without showing his/ her identity card at the College gate. A student must carry his/her identity card while he/she isin the college premises. Duplicate identity card will be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- subject to reporting of loss to the College authorities.
- 9. First year students CANNOT contest college student union election except for the post of DUSU councilors.
- 10. All information is displayed on the student notice board. Hence, students are advised to read notices regularly. All the information is also posted o the college website and the students are advised to stay updated. Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as a plea or an excuse for any delay in any matter.
- 11. Suggestion Box has been provided on the ground floor near the library. Students are advised to make use of it.
- 12. Students are not permitted to receive or entertain visitors in the College. In case such visits are essential, prior permission of the principal is necessary.
- 13. Travel Concession Facility for visit to hometown is available for the students. They are advised to contact the Administrative Office in Room No. 1.
- 14. College has a bus pass verification Centre. To avail this facility, students may contact the concerned staff during 10.00 A.M. to 1.00 P.M. on all working days.
- 15. In case any student is found to be involved in any act of indiscipline or misbehavior within the college premises, the college reserves the right to take appropriate action including rustication.
