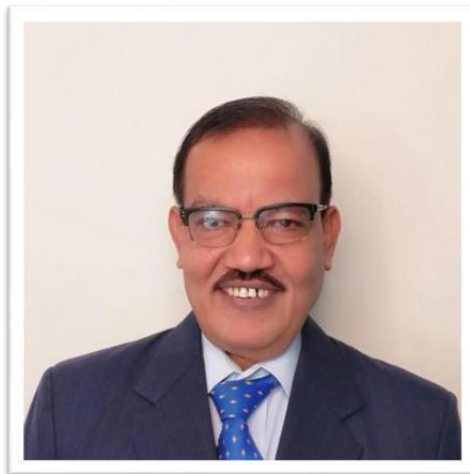

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SATYAWATI COLLEGE: AN INTRODUCTION



The College is centrally located in Ashok Vihar, North West Delhi and has a sprawling campus that is spread over an area of 10 acres. It is a co-educational institution and attracts students from all social strata. There are eleven Departments and twelve courses. Apart from brilliant academic distinctions, our students also have exemplary achievements in extracurricular activities. Her greatest contribution is the fact that she motivated women to join the freedom movement. Her indomitable spirit can be judged by the poems she wrote in jail. Put your head forward before them" This fearlessness inspired innumerable women including Aruna Asif Ali who credited Satyawati with motivating her to join the nationalist movement. Satyawati Devi actively participated in Civil Disobedience Movement. She was the leader of women wing and organized breaking of salt law in Delhi where she and her companions made and distributed salt packets. Her commitment to national liberation and her dedication to women's freedom remains awe-inspiring. Her speeches and acts of defiance during the time of freedom struggle embody the spirit of the College.



Infrastructure

DR. K.P Bhatt Satya Auditorium

The College Auditorium is named after the illustrious freedom fighter Behan Satyawati and Dr. K.P. Bhatt who served as the college principal for 25 years and materialized the dream of an auditorium for the College. It is a great source of pride for both the College and the University, being a state-of-the-art auditorium with a seating capacity of 825 with best quality light and acoustics facilities. 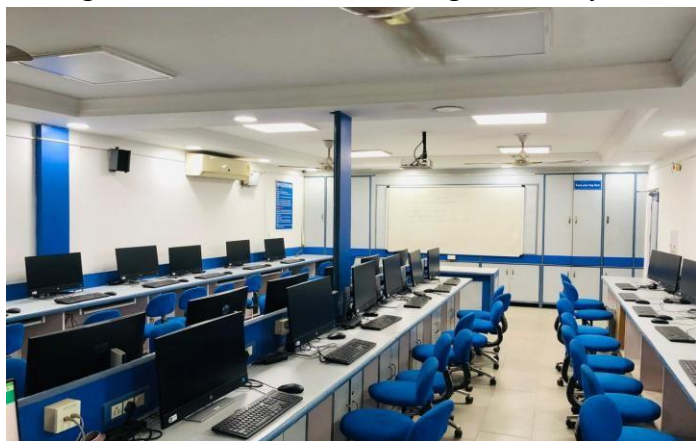
Family Counseling Centre

The Centre organizes a wide range of activities round the year aimed at creating gender awareness. It also provides counseling services to all students.



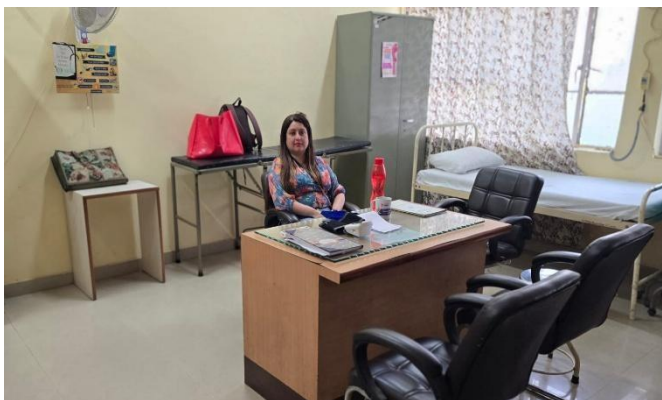
Computer Labs

Satyawati College campus is Wi-Fi enabled. Any student can access internet on his/her laptop/mobile from anywhere in the campus by obtaining a username and password from the server room. There are two well equipped computer laboratories with around 100 ports. The laboratories also have computers with JAWS- a screen reading software, to facilitate reading for visually challenged students.



Medical Facility Room

The College has a well-equipped medical facility located in Room No. 19 of the Old Building which has a full-time nurse for any eventuality. The students can also consult the visiting doctor from 10:00 am to 01:00 pm on all working days.





Swami Vivekananda Library

The college library houses a collection of nearly one lakh volumes, with new additions enriching its holdings every year. It boasts an extensive collection of books, encyclopedias, journals, and periodicals, catering to the diverse academic and research needs of students and faculty. In addition to its extensive collection, the library offers modern facilities such as overhead projectors, LCD projectors, and audio systems for use by departments and student societies. It includes a spacious, air-conditioned reading hall, customized computers with internet access, and assistive technologies, including Braille reading materials and audio learning resources, to support visually impaired students. The library staff is courteous, knowledgeable, and always ready to assist students.



Environmental Academic & Research Centre

The Environmental Academic & Research Centre is well equipped with the smart technologies suited to the demands of the new age. Presence of well facilitated smart board and supported by projector makes the way of presentment more lucid and the sessions more interactive. To fulfill the responsibility of awareness and exposing the students with multi discipline nature of environmental issues as well as proposing the alternative solutions, the laboratory is well equipped with the tools and equipment for the acquisition of reliable scientific data, with precision and accuracy. With the appropriate use of the latest tools supported by information technology, students can put the lab experience to natural world environmental problems like pollution, climate change, resource degradation, biodiversity loss etc. and develop the sense of stewardship of the earth.



Sports Complex

Satyawati College has one of the best sports facilities in the University of Delhi. The Department of Physical Education provides guidance to the students interested in different sporting activities. The College has a double-storey sports complex. A lush green sports ground with a well laid out cricket pitch is a delight for cricketers. Sandeep Suri Memorial Cricket Tournament is an annual extravaganza with widespread participation of teams from Delhi/ NCR region. Several new tournaments have been instituted recently such as Dr. K.P. Bhatt Memorial Volleyball Tournament, Behan Satyawati Memorial Kabbadi & Kho-Kho Tournament, Parakram (Women's Empowerment: Self Defence, Manikarnika Athletics Meet, Rapid Chess Team Tournament). Our students have brought laurels to the College by winning several Inter-College, Inter-university, National and International events. The college provides an ideal sporting atmosphere for differently abled students as well. Some of these students have represented India and won medals in International events as well.





PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSIONS



Admission to all the UG Programs is done on the basis of the eligibility requirements, criteria, and procedures specified by the University on its website, Under-Graduate Bulletin of Information - 2026 (UG-BOI) and Common Seat Allocation System-2026 (CSAS).

The eligibility criteria for every Program offered at the UG level have been published in the UG Bulletin of Information-2026 (UG BOI-2026) (available on the admission website of the University, (admission/uod.ac.in)). Candidates must check the eligibility criteria carefully from UG BOI-2026 and the admission website. There are no additional eligibility criteria besides the ones stipulated by the University through its website, UG BOI 2026 and CSAS-2026, published on the admission website of the UoD.

For the academic year 2026-27, admission to all UG Programs of UoD will be done on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test- Under-Graduate 2026 CUET (UG) – 2026.

1. CUET (UG) - 2026 is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The candidate may note that the role of NTA is limited to the conduct of CUET (UG) - 2026, declaration of results, and handling of queries related to the entrance examination. Simply appearing in CUET (UG) - 2026 will not be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in UoD. For admission to the UoD UG Programs, a candidate has to apply in CSAS-2026.
2. Before initiating the application process, the candidate is advised to read the contents of UG BOI-2026 and CSAS-2026 carefully, and consult the Delhi University Act, 1922, its amendments and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, Regulations, and Notifications of the UoD available on the University



website, www.du.ac.in shall be final and binding.

3. Candidates applying to UoD must refer to the UG BoI-2026 for Common Minimum Eligibility criteria and Program-Specific Eligibility criteria. (http://du.ac.in/uploads/new-web/21042026_BOI-UG.pdf).
4. The candidate must refer to the list of Programs, Program-Specific Eligibility Criteria, seat matrix, fee structure and other relevant information published on the admission website of UoD before selecting the Programs.
5. Determination of eligibility and verification of documents for admission to UoD will be the sole purview of UoD.
6. Only the candidate who has appeared in CUET (UG) - 2026 and has passed Class XIIth from a single recognized board will be eligible to apply for the CSAS-2026.
7. It is mandatory for the candidate to apply and fill preferences online in CSAS-2026 of UoD through the admission website of UoD (<https://admission.uod.ac.in>). Application submitted through any other mode will not be accepted under any circumstances.
8. Seat allocation to all UG Programs will be based solely on the scores obtained in CUET(UG) - 2026.
9. For seat allocation in Performance-based Programs, ECA and Sports Supernumerary Quotas, a combined score of CUET (UG) - 2026 and Performance Tests/ Trials and/or certificates will be considered.
10. Candidates are advised to check their dashboard, email, and admission website (www.admission.uod.ac.in) for all communications and updates related to admissions.
11. College/UoD will not be responsible for a candidate's lack of awareness of the admission guidelines, schedule, Eligibility Criteria, and CSAS-2026 rules. It is the sole responsibility of the candidates to keep checking the dashboard, email and admission website of UoD regularly.
12. Non-compliance with the requirements for admission, including non-submission of relevant documents and/or non-payment of Fee/s within the stipulated date and time, the candidate will lose his/her right to admission.
13. The candidate will be required to appear in person to verify the original documents as and when notified by the University/College.
14. It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to prove his/her eligibility for claiming reservation under any of the reserved categories (including PwBD, CW, and KM). Candidates applying under SC/ ST/ OBCNCL/ EWS/Minority/ CW/ Pw BD/ KM categories will be required to upload the certificates/documents of the respective reserved category/sub-category issued by the Competent Issuing Authority.
15. If at any stage, documents submitted by the candidate relating to the admission are found to be fake/non-genuine and/or fabricated or in any other manner defective, the said candidate will not be given admission and if already admitted, admission will be canceled without any prior notice in this regard. If the same is found after completing the Program, his/her degree will be revoked and appropriate legal action will be taken against him/her.
16. A candidate's participation in the admission process will be provisional. If, at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be canceled ipso facto and appropriate legal action will be taken against such candidate.
17. The University or the College will not refund Admission Fee in case any candidate is found ineligible at a later stage.
18. The University or the College reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate who violates the rules and regulations laid down by the UoD.
19. The Common Seat Allocation System 2026 is divided in Three Phases:
 - PHASE I: APPLYING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI
 - PHASE II: FILLING THE PREFERENCES FOR PROGRAMS AND COLLEGES
 - PHASE III: ALLOCATION-CUM-ADMISSION

For admission to UoD, the candidate will have to successfully complete all the three phases of CSAS within the stipulated time.



SEAT ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION

On declaration of the allocation result/s, the candidate must login to his/her CSAS(UG)-2026 dashboard for acceptance of the allocated seat, if offered.

It is the responsibility of the candidate to login to the dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation, and if allocated s(he) must complete all admission formalities.

ADVICE

Candidates must check the schedule of activities for admission, which are available on the admission website of UoD (admission.uod.ac.in).

ACCEPTANCE OF THE PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate **must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat** before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the particular round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate.

ADVICE

*To participate in subsequent rounds, the candidate **must accept** the allocated seat within the stipulated time.*

In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round (due to allocation in supernumerary quota), s(he) must "Accept" and take admission in ONLY ONE Allocated Seat.

Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent regular allocation rounds of CSAS(UG)-2026.

ONLINE APPROVAL BY THE COLLEGE

Once the candidate "Accepts" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will verify the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate online on the CSAS portal. The College will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

1. Minimum Eligibility of the candidate.
2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the candidate.
3. Subject Mapping: Only those CUET(UG)-2026 Language and/or Domain specific papers in which the candidate has passed Class XII will be considered.
4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the candidate.

During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to Section 6.3).

After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate. No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In case of Approval:

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate **will have to pay the 'Admission Fee'** (refer to Section 6.4) within the stipulated time.

In case of Rejection:

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College will state the reason for rejection. For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.
2. Non-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.
3. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.
4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.

ADVICE

Candidates must regularly check their dashboard and respond to queries (if any) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

RESPOND TO QUERIES (IF ANY) DURING APPROVALS BY COLLEGES/DEPARTMENTS/CENTRES

During the online approval process, if a college raises query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS(UG)-2026.

ADVICE

Candidates must make the payment well in time and not wait for the last date.

ADMISSION TO THE PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

After the College approves the application, the candidate must pay the admission fee to confirm the allotted seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment realization of the admission fee.

If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The candidate will forfeit all the rights to the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent regular CSAS(UG)-2026 allocation rounds.

SUBSEQUENT ALLOCATION ROUNDS

Based on the availability of the seats that arise due to rejections, cancellations, and withdrawals, the University may announce multiple allocation rounds. The UoD will display the vacant seats on its admission website (admission.uod.ac.in) before every allocation round.

All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option (refer to Chapter 8) in a particular round will be considered for the respective CSAS(UG)-2026 allocation round, subject to availability of seats.

Candidates who were allocated their first preference in a round will not be considered in subsequent round/s of allocation.

UPGRADE OR FREEZE

All admitted candidates get opportunity to opt for "Upgrade" or "Freeze".

UPGRADE

An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option, which will allow upgradation to a higher preference where s(he) had taken admission. Admitted candidates who opt for Upgrade will be upgraded, subject to the availability of seats and as per the allocation policy.

A candidate who opts for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College Combinations that were higher in preference than the allocated one.

Choosing the 'Upgrade' option means that the candidate consents to be considered for allocation of a seat, as per his/her higher preferences where s(he) is already admitted, in the subsequent round (if any). If a candidate chooses the 'Upgrade' option and a new preference is allocated to him/her as per the allocation policy, his/her current seat (i.e. on which s(he) is currently admitted) will be auto-canceled. In such a case, his/her "Acceptance" to the upgraded seat will be auto-accepted and the fees will be auto-adjusted. In case a candidate gets upgraded and the admission fee of the upgraded seat is more than already deposited fees, the candidate will have to mandatorily pay the differential amount within the stipulated time failing which the provisionally upgraded seat will be cancelled, and the candidate will be out of the CSAS.

The Program + College Combination in which s(he) had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate

in any subsequent round. Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent regular allocation rounds.

The Upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated his/her first preference. The upgrade option will not be available to the candidate who had opted for “Freeze”.

It is the responsibility of the candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. If a candidate fails or misses the opportunity to choose the 'upgrade' option, for whatever reasons, s(he) will not be allowed to participate in the upgradation process and the University of Delhi will not consider any grievance in this regard under any circumstances.

In case a candidate does not get upgraded, his/her admission to the earlier seat will be retained. Selecting upgrade does not mean an assurance of seat in the next/ any subsequent allocation rounds. Upgradation is subject to:

- a. Program-Specific Merit
- b. Order of Preference
- c. Availability of seats

ADVICE

Candidates must "Freeze" their admission only if they are satisfied with the allocated seat and do not want to be considered for subsequent allocations.

FREEZE

A candidate who has taken admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it, should submit a 'Freeze' request through his/her dashboard. **On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation."**

By selecting "Freeze," the currently allotted admission option (Program) will be treated as final and cannot be modified in any subsequent allocation rounds. The candidate will not be considered for any further seat allocation.

ADVICE

Once the freeze option has been exercised, a candidate will not be allowed to upgrade.

Candidates opting for neither 'Upgrade' nor 'Freeze':

If an admitted candidate neither opts for 'Upgrade' nor 'Freeze' and remains inactive, the admission taken by him/her will be retained and s(he) will not be considered for upgradation.

CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT/ADMISSION

1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to pay the admission fees within the stipulated time.
3. Failure to respond to the query(ies) (if raised on the candidate's dashboard) may lead to the cancellation of allocated seat.
4. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/ certificate(s) is/ are found to be invalid/ fraudulent.
5. The provisionally Allocated Seat/ Admission will be canceled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is cancelled due to the above-mentioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE

A candidate who has taken admission in a Program but wishes to withdraw from it, can do so through his/her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of **Rs.1000.00 (non-refundable)**.



A candidate who withdraws his/her admission will forfeit his/her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD. No further participation in any of the subsequent regular allocation rounds, if any, will be allowed.

The Withdrawal option will remain suspended on the announcement of Spot Admission round/s (if any).

The entire admission process for UG Program is online, therefore, any request sent through Post/Fax/E- mail/WhatsApp/by hand for withdrawal of admission will not be entertained.

MID-ENTRY

Through the provision of Mid-Entry, the candidates who either failed to apply for CSAS(UG)-2026 within the stipulated time (during Phase I) or could not complete Phase II, and are desirous of participating in CSAS(UG)- 2026 can participate (as and when announced by the University). Such candidate can do so by paying a Mid – Entry fee of **Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable)**.

Mid-Entry will only be considered after successful remittance of the Mid-Entry fee through the CSAS(UG)-2026 portal.

A candidate who applies to CSAS(UG)-2026 mid-way will not hold any right to claim the seats allocated to candidates who had applied to CSAS(UG)-2026 during the initial stage. Allocation of seats to such candidates may be considered for subsequent rounds (if any), subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria, availability of seats, and other CSAS(UG)-2026 rules.

Once the seat has been allocated to the candidate who has applied to CSAS(UG)-2026 midway, it will be mandatory for him/her to take admission on the allocated seat. Failure to accept the allocated seat will forfeit the candidate's right to seek admission to UoD.

Merely applying through Mid-Entry does not guarantee an allocation of seat through CSAS(UG)-2026.

Mid-Entry will not be allowed for ECA, Sports, CW Supernumerary Quotas; Performance-Based Programs (i.e., B.A.(H) Music, B.Sc. (PE, HE & S)) and Practical-based Program (i.e. BFA).

SPOT

After the completion of regular CSAS(UG)-2026 rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot Round/s of admission.

Candidates who applied for CSAS(UG)-2026 but are not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of the Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Round/s.

Before the announcement of every Spot Round, all admitted candidates will get an opportunity to opt for Upgrade. The vacancy of seats for a Spot Round will be declared after the completion of upgradation process of the candidates who opt for it, subject to upgradation rules.

On the announcement of a Spot Round, the dashboard of all admitted candidates will be kept in freeze mode and they will neither be considered for upgrades nor be allowed to withdraw their admissions.

To be considered in a Spot Admission Round, the candidate will have to opt for 'Spot Admission' through his/her dashboard.

For every Spot Admission round, the University will display the vacant seats of each Program. A desirous candidate will have to opt for the Program/s +College Combination in which s(he) wishes to be considered.

In Spot Admissions, allocations will be done on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Availability of seats
2. Program-Specific merit
3. Order of Preference of College/s
4. Category

5. Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document (CSAS(UG)-2026), UG BOI-2026, or published on the admission website of UoD

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a Spot Admission round. Failure to accept the allocated seat in the Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and s(he) will be out of CSAS(UG)-2026.

There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the Spot Admission rounds.

TIE - BREAKING RULES

In the event of a tie, where two or more candidates have the same CUET(UG)-2026 merit score for a Program + College Combination, the following rules will be applied in the stated order to break the tie:

1. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 3 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
2. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 4 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
3. The candidates with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in the Best 5 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
4. Age of the candidate; preference will be given to the candidate having an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in the Class X certificate).
5. The candidate with a higher percentage of aggregate marks in Class X will be given preference

Note:

1. If the marksheet contains both Class XI and Class XII marks, only Class XII marks will be considered.
2. Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to the Theory, Practical or Total, will be the sole responsibility of the candidate. Incorrect or mis-information provided by the candidate may lead to cancellation of allocated seat.
3. If the Class X or/and Class XII mark sheet contains CGPA/ Grades, the candidate will have to convert the Grades into equivalent marks/percentages as per the issuing examination board (refer to Annexure II for Grade conversion).

REMITTANCE OF ADMISSION FEE

Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful realization of the Admission Fee. The admission fee must be paid only through the candidate's dashboard. If the admission fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances.

For all payments, candidates should use any of these payment modes: Net Banking/ Debit Card/ Credit Card / UPI.

VIRTUAL WALLET

Upon the successful remittance of the Admission Fee, a virtual wallet will be created for the candidate.

In case a candidate gets upgraded and the Admission Fee of the upgraded seat is more than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, s(he) will have to pay the differential amount within the stipulated time. Failure to pay the differential fee amount will be considered as forfeiting the offered seat. This will lead to cancellation of allocated seat.

In case the admission fee of the upgraded seat is less than the amount in the virtual wallet of the candidate, it will be auto-debited upon receiving approval from the College.

PAYMENT FAILURES

In the likely case of payment failure related issues:

1. If the amount is not deducted from the account, the candidate must try paying again before the payment deadline.

ADVICE

Upon successful payment of the Admission Fee, the candidate must keep a record of transaction details for future reference.

ADVICE

Candidates must complete the fee payment process well before the deadline to avoid any last-minute haste.

2. The candidate must ensure a stable internet connection is used for making the online payment.
3. The candidate must use the correct credentials to make a successful payment.
4. If the amount is deducted, but a notification is not received, the candidate may seek confirmation from his/her source bank.
5. If a successful transaction is confirmed from the source Bank and the payment failure continues to be reflected on the dashboard, in that case, the candidate may contact the ICICI Eazypay Payment Gateway Helpline between 9.30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday to Saturday (except second and fourth Saturdays) at the following email and mobile number:

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS



Common Minimum Eligibility

The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.

For the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/ degree of only one board will be considered. (For example, if a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

Program Specific Eligibilities

Candidate must refer to the Program-Specific Eligibility to choose the subjects in which s(he) should appear in CUET (UG) – 2026.

It is mandatory for the candidates to appear in CUET(UG)-2026 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/ has passed Class XII. For the purpose of ascertaining Program Specific Eligibility and for mapping the CUET subject(s) with Class XII subject(s), marksheet of more than one recognized board may be considered provided the candidate has passed those subjects in Class XII.

SOCIETIES AND COMMITTEES



1. THE ARTS AND CULTURE SOCIETY

The Arts and Culture Society provides a platform for the expression of the creative energy of the young students. The society organizes dance and musical performances and events that enliven the college life and groom the students. The College has many students who are trained in classical as well as folk forms of dance. The society taps this talent pool and trains the students for performances and competitions within the college and other as well as universities.

2. 'ABHIVYAKTI' – THE DEBATING SOCIETY

The Debating Society regularly organizes intra, inter-college and National level debates in English, Hindi, Urdu and Sanskrit. The Society through its activities seeks to cultivate a research oriented competitive debating culture with emphasis on listening skills, intelligent ideas, responsive approach and competent spoken skills. Abhivyakti has conducted debates on various issues such as culture, history, politics, current affairs, law, sports and life. Over the years, our debaters have represented the College in Inter-college, intracollege and national level debates and have made the college proud by winning several prizes. Several events are organized by Abhivyakti that include Jaswant Kaur Memorial National Debate, (Cash Prize Pool: 25000, sponsored by: Prof. Indrajeet Kaur), Janak Kapoor Memorial National Debate, (Cash Prize Pool: 23000, sponsored by: Prof. Anju Seth), Sudesh Kumari Memorial National Debate (Cash Prize Pool: 10000, sponsored by: Prof. Nirmal Jindal), 5. Behan Satyawati Memorial Parliamentary Debate Competition (Cash Prize Pool: 8000, sponsored by Society funds and Registration fees), Vaktavyam The Turncoat Debate, (Cash Prize Pool: 4600, sponsored by Society Funds and Registration fee), Intracollege Conventional Debate Competition (Cash Prize Pool: 2500, sponsored by Society funds).

3. 'THE THIRD ACT' – DRAMATICS SOCIETY

One of the most active societies of the college is the Dramatics Society, 'The Third Act', holds theatre workshops, lectures and drama productions. This society recognizes the need for young people to express their emotions creatively. Through focused theatre workshops, hidden acting talents are recognized and polished which invariably results in brilliant performances by amateurs. The students have been provided a spacious room in Block A to conduct their workshops and carry on with their practice sessions.

4. FILM SOCIETY (CINEPAT)

The film society conducts regular film screenings which are followed by discussions, analysis and overview of the theme, technique etc. This society seeks to use films as a medium for collective learning and creating an understanding that films have there to offer than more entertainment. The society sensitizes students to the fact that films can be agents of social change.

5. PHOTOGRAPHY SOCIETY (TASVEER)

Tasveer Society of Satyawati College brings together individuals who share an interest in photography, encouraging them to learn, exchange ideas, and appreciate both its artistic and technical aspects. The society encourages students to study light and it also imparts tips on composition in the form of workshops, seminars, event coverage and photo walks. Each year the society organizes such activities that give students a chance to learn photography and utilize their camera to the fullest and become sensitized to the world around. The society focuses on the interaction between experts and students in addition to enhancing peer learning in photography and build an environment to capture memories forever. The society has its own studio and Dslr Camera which helps student learn the art of photography the best.



6. 'SAKSHAM' COMMITTEE FOR CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT

This committee prepares students for their professional lives after college. Students acquire soft skills through workshops, lectures conducted by eminent people. The Committee coordinates with the placement cell of Delhi University and assists students in the registration process. In the previous academic year, the committee invited finance, banking and health management companies to the college for campus placements. Several students were selected for recruitment.

7. FOREIGN STUDENTS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Foreign Students' Advisory Committee oversees the activities, problems and difficulties, if any, faced by students from other Countries. The Committee facilitates participation of foreign students in the college activities and ensures that they feel at home in their new surroundings.

8. SC/ST COMMITTEE

The committee's aim is to empower students belonging to the deprived sections admitted to the college under reserved categories. It conducts workshops for personality development, acquiring computer skills and developing communication skills for these students. There are remedial classes held for the benefit of students who find it difficult to cope with the curriculum.

9. THE NORTH EAST SOCIETY

The North East Society aims to create a welcoming environment for students from the North East in College. It seeks to enable them to fully participate in college life. The Society also observes an annual North East Fest which celebrates the unique culture of the region. The Society organizes various activities like lectures and screening of films and documentaries to highlight the issues impacting the people of the North-East.

10. 'UJJWALA' –THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college publishes a magazine annually which has poems, stories, essays by students and teachers. The College Magazine provides students with an opportunity to express themselves creatively. The magazine named 'Ujjwala' is multi-lingual with a section each in English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Urdu.

11. INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT

It deals with all the incidents amounting to any kind of Sexual Harassment within the premises of the College.

12. FAMILY COUNSELING CENTRE

The Family Counseling Centre organizes a wide range of activities round the year aimed at creating gender awareness. The Centre maintains a library which has a rich collection of books, pamphlets, and films on issues related to gender. This Centre also provides counselling services to students.

13. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell is committed towards providing a barrier-free environment to facilitate quality education and equitable access to career opportunities for differently-abled students. It has provided laptops (with special software for VH students) to most of the PWD students. Equal Opportunity Cell has also provided 26 DAISY players to our VH students and got repaired old iPods. Regular meetings are held to address student issues.

14. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The NCC unit of the college trains boys and girls as cadets in the Army and Navy wings. Our cadets have had the honor of participating in the Republic Day parade and Special National Camps. Rigorous training that the students undergo in NCC helps them maintain a fine balance between mind and body.

15. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The College has an active group of student volunteers associated with the NSS. The NSS volunteers conduct reading sessions for visually challenged students. Their activities include working with nearby slum population, organizing and participating in blood donation camps, Red Ribbon Club, teaching children of construction workers in the college campus. The NSS organizes an Annual Function "Sarokar" every year.

16. STUDENTS UNION

Satyawati College has a Students' Union which is elected by the students every year. However, a first-year student can only contest for the post of Central Councilor, the rest of the posts of the union are open only to second and third year students.



17. ALUMNI COMMITTEE

Satyawati Alumni committee has been working very actively over the years. The College collects and updates alumni information through social and electronic media, enabling it to maintain regular communication and strengthen its engagement with former students. The Alumni meet is organized by the College Alumni Committee. Online registration facilitates in updating the list of alumni.

18. SUICIDE PREVENTION AWARENESS AND MENTAL HEALTH STRESS BUSTER PROGRAM (मनसखा)

The Suicide Prevention Awareness and Health Stress Buster Program, established by the University of Delhi, functions as a nodal agency dedicated to promoting mental health awareness and suicide prevention initiatives. This initiative adopted by Satyawati College is committed to fostering a safe, supportive and emotionally resilient campus. The program works to promote mental well-being, spreading awareness about suicide prevention and encouraging students to seek help without fear of stigma.

Along with these committees, which are open to all students, every department has its own committee which is open to the students of that particular discipline.





UDHMODYA FOUNDATION (Entrepreneurship Cell)

Udhmodya Foundation, has been established by the University of Delhi for promoting Innovation and Entrepreneurial culture, among all in general and students in particular. It is a Section-8 Company set-up to facilitate a culture of innovation and creativity by encouraging entrepreneurial activities across the colleges/ Departments/Centers of the University. In compliance with the directions of University of Delhi, Satyawati College has also set up an 'Entrepreneurship Cell'. This E-cell has been a step towards achieving a sustainable startup ecosystem. 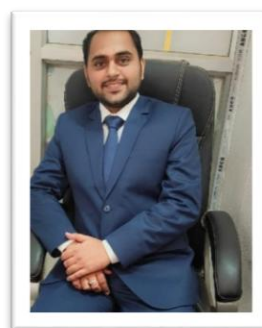

Discipline & Attendance Rules

1. Students are accountable for their conduct to the Principal of the College and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the College, which may amount to breach of repute, discipline or interference with the discipline and normal working of the College. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violating any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary actions involve warning, and/or fine and/or suspension from the class, from examination, from the College or any such action as provided in ordinance XV-B and the rules of discipline framed under it. Pending an enquiry into his/her conduct, the authorities have the right to suspend a student from the College.
2. Students should take proper care of College property and must not spoil or cause any damage to or tamper with furniture and fittings.
3. Names of students who indulge in acts of indiscipline in the university examination may be struck off from the College rolls.
4. Ragging in any form is banned. Any student found indulging in it would be guilty of gross indiscipline and an FIR will be filed against him/her with the police as per the decision of the Hon. Supreme Court. Anyone found indulging in eve-teasing or sexual harassment shall also be dealt with under ordinance XV-B, XV-C and XV-D.
5. In the matter of attendance lectures and tutorials, the students of the College are governed by the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi including DU EC Resolution No. 138 dated 05- 06- 1975. No student is eligible for promotion to the next higher class or to take a University Examination unless he/she has attended two-third of the lectures, tutorials and practical held separately. As per decision of 370th meeting of staff council, students enrolled in the first year (2019-20) are to have minimum Sixty Seven Percent **(67%)** attendance in each semester in order to appear for semester exam, failing which they will be debarred for the appearing in the said exam.
6. All application for leave of absence due to sickness must be supported by a Medical Certificate and should reach the Principal not later than a week after the student returns to the College after his/ her illness. This rule will be enforced strictly in giving benefit of attendance on medical ground.
7. The areas near the classrooms are marked as the Silence Zone. Therefore, students are advised not to loiter/ make noise in this zone. They are advised to utilize their free periods for creative activities such as visiting library, playing games etc.
8. An Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. A student is not allowed to enter the college premises without showing his/ her identity card at the College gate. A student must carry his/her identity card while he/she is in the college premises. Duplicate identity card will be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- subject to reporting of loss to the College authorities.
9. First year students CANNOT contest college student union election except for the post of DUSU councilors.
10. All information is displayed on the student notice board. Hence, students are advised to read notices regularly. All the information is also posted on the college website and the students are advised to stay updated. Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as a plea or an excuse for any delay in any matter.
11. Suggestion Box has been provided on the ground floor near the library. Students are advised to make use of it.
12. Students are not permitted to receive or entertain visitors in the College. In case such visits are essential, prior permission of the principal is necessary.
13. Travel Concession Facility for visit to hometown is available for the students. They are advised to contact the Administrative Office in Room No. 1.
14. College has a bus pass verification Centre. To avail this facility, students may contact the concerned staff during 10.00 A.M. to 1.00 P.M. on all working days.
15. In case any student is found to be involved in any act of indiscipline or misbehavior within the college premises, the college reserves the right to take appropriate action including rustication.

4. Candidates must reach the examination centre at least half an hour before the commencement of the examination. Candidate/s will not be allowed to enter into the examination hall after half an hour of the commencement of the examination.
5. No Candidate shall be allowed to leave the examination hall before half an hour of the **completion** of the examination.
6. The Superintendent of Examination, the Invigilation Staff, **and** the Members of the Visiting Team/s are free to do physical search of the candidates at any time during the course of examination or before entering into the examination hall to ensure that they do not have any unauthorized material in their possession.
7. The cases of the candidates booked for use of unfair means and/or for resorting to disorderly conduct in University examinations shall be dealt in accordance with the University rules.
