



NESSDU Annual Sports Meet 2024 - 25





Seminar Lecture Organized by the Northeast Society of Satyawati College (M)

Title: Indigenous: Perception, Problems, and Prospects Speaker: Prof. Deepshika Mahanta Bortamuly Affiliation: Department of English, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi Venue: Seminar room Date: 28th February, 2025 5 The Northeast Society of Satyawati College (M) organized an insightful talk on the topic "Indigenous: Perception, Problems, and Prospects." The session was delivered by Prof. Deepshika Mahanta Bortamuly from the Department of English, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi. The seminar aimed to shed light on the historical, social, and contemporary issues concerning indigenous communities while also exploring potential solutions and future opportunities for their development.Prof. Bortamuly initiated the session by providing a comprehensive understanding of the term 'Indigenous' and its relevance in the socio-political and cultural discourse. She emphasized how indigenous communities have historically faced marginalization and the struggle to preserve their identity in an increasingly globalized world. She focused on perception of indigenous communities, problem faced by these communities such as challenges of political representation and policy neglect and also discussed about prospects and the way forward such as the impact of government policies and affirmative action in empowering indigenous groups. The seminar was followed by an interactive session, where students raised thought-provoking questions and Prof. Bortamuly provided insightful responses and encouraged students to engage in further research and advocacy for indigenous issues. The seminar proved to be an enlightening experience for all attendees, fostering a deeper understanding of indigenous concerns. Prof. Deepshika Mahanta Bortamuly's lecture not only highlighted the challenges faced by indigenous communities but also instilled a sense of responsibility among students to contribute to a more inclusive and equitable society. The Northeast Society expressed gratitude to the speaker for her valuable insights and to the organizing team for making the event a success.
